**Abstract:** Dr. Boyd will discuss the remarkable renewable energy revolution that is underway globally, with the rate of growth in wind and solar repeatedly surpassing expert projections. Canada's progress will be evaluated, and the city of Vancouver's plan for becoming fossil fuel free by 2050 will be introduced. **Bio:** Dr. David R. Boyd is an environmental lawyer and internationally renowned expert on human rights and the environment. He was the executive director of Ecojustice, argued cases before the Supreme Court of Canada, worked as a special advisor on sustainability for Prime Minister Martin, and advises many governments on environmental sustainability. He co-chairs Vancouver's effort to become the world's greenest city by 2020 with Mayor Gregor Robertson. Boyd is the author of seven books and over 100 reports and articles on environmental law and policy. His books include Cleaner, Greener, Healthier: A Prescription for Stronger Canadian Environmental Laws and Policies (2015), The Right to a Healthy Environment: Revitalizing Canada's Constitution (2012), The Environmental Rights Revolution: A Global Study of Constitutions, Human Rights, and the Environment (2011), and Unnatural Law: Rethinking Canadian Environmental Law and Policy (2003).
